

### Accessing someone else's ePEARL

1. The plan for this chapter will be to learn about:
  - How to provide feedback in ePEARL
  - The importance of giving feedback
2. Providing feedback encourages critical thinking among peers. It is also important to think about someone else's work in terms of respect and effort made. Let's get started! We will explore how Megan gives feedback on a peer's artifact or portfolio. In the share page, by clicking on **Shared with me** the list of folders, or entries that other students have shared with Megan will appear.
3. By clicking on any of the displayed listings, the portfolio opens in a new window. By clicking on **Artifacts**, Megan can see all the work shared with her. Peer feedback boxes appear as editable windows. Peers will not be able to edit or upload anything to another student's ePEARL.
4. Now Megan provides feedback on Einat's portfolio and saves it. For example: "Your portfolio really shows all the work you have done during this year. I like the way you personalized it. I would suggest you to use ePEARL to record and practice your presentations".
5. When Megan closes the window, she will still be in her portfolio in the **shared with me** page,
6. Reflecting: Some tips on peer feedback... When a student gives feedback she should:
  - Think about positive aspects of her classmate's work.
  - Reflect on the goals and the strategies used. Were the goals met, and did the strategies help?
