1. The plan for this chapter will be to learn about:
 - How a student can record within ePEARL.
 - The multiple uses of this recording feature
2. Let's get started! Let's explore Megan's portfolio again. She worked on a project named "Pieces" in Arts Education. For this artifact Megan performed one of the first songs she was taught to play on her guitar. Her task goal was to learn how to play an entire popular song. As a strategy she planned to practice for five minutes every day. And this is her strategy in relation to this artifact. Let's listen to Meg playing the guitar.
3. A recorder is provided for the student to attach audio clips to her work. This powerful tool allows a student to:
 - Record group work communications
 - Rehearse a musical instrument
 - Read for fluency and expression
 - Perform dramatic plays
 - Record mock radio news reports
 - Practice oral presentation skills
4. First, the student clicks on the **recorder**. The audio recording may be no longer than a minute and a half. A small window appears with three recording buttons. Now the recorder is ready.
5. Once the reading is finished the student clicks on **stop**.
6. Finally the student saves the recording by clicking on "confirm save". this step may take longer to complete depending on the length of the recording.
7. Now the students can click on **play** to listen to the reading. This process can help peers provide feedback on the reader or presenter's performance. If a student wants to record a longer segment, she may do so by recording into generic audio software and then, attach this audio file to her work. You can find a chapter on attaching files later in this tutorial.

 - What are some creative ways you can use this tool?
 - You can record some examples to show your students.
